ABOUT THE CAST

SANDRA BECKER is a Speech-Language Pathologist. Sandra served as President of TCP during 1997/98. During that time she also appeared in SYLVIA, THROCKMORTON, TX 76083 and A COMPANY OF WAYWARD SAINTS. Sandra made her debut on the TCP stage with a cameo role in TIME OUT FOR GINGER in 1990 and has since appeared in 16 productions, including THE GLASS MENAGERIE, SHERLOCK HOLMES AND THE LOST ROSE, BRIGHTON BEACH MEMOIRS, ANDROCLES AND THE LION, and DADDY'S DYIN (WHO'S GOT THE WILL?), and has won 8 acting and several backstage ERWIN awards. She also appeared in the Arts Council of Tahlequah world premiere of MOUNTAIN WINDSONG.

JONATHAN BROWN made his TCP debut in OUR HEARTS WERE YOUNG AND GAY in 1984 while still a high school student. He also appeared in the high school production of LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE. Before returning to the TCP stage in 1996, Jonathan appeared in the NSU production of BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS and in the Saloon Show at Silver Dollar City. Since rejoining TCP he has appeared in MAN OF LA MANCHA, DADDY'S DYIN' (WHO'S GOT THE WILL?), and A COMPANY OF WAYWARD SAINTS, for which he won an ERWIN Award for Best Actor. Jonathan is currently President of TCP and serves on the Arts Council of Tahlequah Board of Directors. He is the Treasurer and Publicity Chair for the Green Country AIDS Coalition and is the Northeast Representative for the Oklahoma Community Planning Group.

MELISSA CAST is a Librarian at NSU. Since her first appearance with TCP in DADDY'S DYIN' (WHO'S GOT THE WILL?), for which she received a Best Female Newcomer ERWIN, she has appeard in SYLVIA and A COMPANY OF WAYWARD SAINTS, earning an additional ERWIN for Best Supporting Actress for the latter. In her free time Melissa enjoys traveling, pottery and gardening. She would like to say "hi" to her mom and dad.

REGINA HARRIS, owner of Little Blessings Daycare in Cookson, is making her TCP debut. While in high school she appeared in productions of RUMBLE and YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN. Regina is a member of the Cookson Volunteer Fire Dept. Ladies Auxiliary. She is married to Carroll Harris and has four children, Rusty, Coleman, Valerie and Olivia. She has lived in Tahlequah since her high school years.

BRYAN LEE JONES, a freshman at NSU, made his TCP debut last season in A COMPANY OF WAYWARD SAINTS. Bryan says, "I would like to say that I have lived in Tahlequah all my life, but I have not lived all my life yet." His hobbies include music (playing bass and listening) and comics (collecting and reading). He highly recommends Kevin Smith's <u>Daredevil</u>.

DAWN KIGHT, Tahlequah High School junior and Sonic carhop, has previously appeared in minor roles in the ACT/TCP productions of SOUTH PACIFIC and CAROUSEL. She has also had leading roles in some school plays. She is the daughter of Chester & Ecil Kight and the sister of Darin & Robert Kight and Margaret Cook. She is in the Tahlequah High School Concert Choir and is active in her Church Youth Group.

BENJAMIN MALONE is a senior Finance/MIS major at NSU, and is president of the Phi Lambda Chi fraternity. It has been reported that Ben is very good at catching bats. This is his first TCP production.

RENÉE RAE RIDGE is a Library Technician in the NSU Library. She has served as Secretary for TCP for several years and has worked backstage and as assistant director for many plays. She has appeared in productions of THE (FEMALE) ODD COUPLE, ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST, GO BACK FOR MURDER, OUT OF SIGHT, OUT OF MURDER, THE NIGHT OF JANUARY 16, THE SWORD OF ZORRO, and THE UNINVITED. She has received ERWIN Awards for both acting and her backstage involvement. Renée freely admits to being a Star Trek Fanatic!

ANDREW VASSAR, a Doctoral Candidate at the University of Arkansas and Assistant Professor of Business Communications at NSU, is also making his TCP debut. He has appeared in one other play, THE WEN by Saul Bellow, as a wacky professor. He is writing his doctorate on Native American Theatre. Andrew has been in Tahlequah since August and is married to Jan Cunningham. They have two cats and a dog.

SHANE-BRUMLEY WARD is a new face to TCP audiences, but no stranger to the stage. A junior at NSU, Shane has appeared in the NSU productions of THE DIVINERS, and HOW GERTRUDE STORMED THE PHILOSOPHY CLUB and was an understudy in NASTAVNIC and THREE SISTERS. Shane enjoys writing and reading and practices the religion of "Xena: Warrior Princess" and "Hercules."

JIM WINTERBOTTOM is a Librarian at NSU. He has previously appeared in the TCP productions of MAN OF LA MANCHA, SYLVIA and A COMPANY OF WAYWARD SAINTS, winning an ERWIN for the latter performance. Jim came to Tahlequah from Canada in 1996.

AMELIA YOUNG appeared in the title role in last season's TCP production of CHARLOTTE'S WEB and has already been cast in a featured role in the next TCP production THE BEST CHRISTMAS PAGEANT EVER. Amelia likes to read and write stories. She is currently writing a vampire story.
