She has directed the TCP productions of The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, The Wind in the Willows, and Alice in Wonderland. She took home Best Production ERWINs for The Best Christmas Pageant Ever and Alice in Wonderland. Peggy has participated in theatre in Washington, Oregon, Massachusetts, Arizona, and Oklahoma and has done acting and tech in high school and university environments, as well as costume design for academic and professional theatre. She is the Workshop Director for the 2003 National Festival of the Puppeteers of America to be held in Tahlequah in July, 2003. Peggy stays busy keeping up with husband, Brian, and sons, Matthew and Adam.

Brian Kaney (Scenic Designer and all around helpful guy) is an Associate Professor of Physics at NSU and is currently on a research sabbatical with the National Severe Storms Laboratory. Brian has done tech work for such TCP productions as *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, The Wind in the Willows, Alice in Wonderland, James & the Giant Peach* and *Look Homeward, Angel*. He received a Special Recognition ERWIN for his work on *Alice in Wonderland*.

Jake Abercrombie (12), who previously appeared in the TCP production of *James & the Giant Peach*, is in the 7th grade. Jake plays the violin and flute and lists his hobbies as building models, playing computer/playstation, and manipulating legos into fun things. His favorite TV character is SpongeBob SquarePants and says his favorite color is yellow. He has two cats and a dog, as well as other various pets over the years, including a crab. He plays golf and likes to swim.

Dudley Brown recently retired from the Tahlequah Public School system. He has been involved with TCP for 22 years and has participated both on and off stage. He has also participated in the Lyric Chorus-Light Opera Co., as well as various high school and college plays, and community theatres around the world. Dudley is involved in Habitat for Humanity, Help-in-Crisis, Hospice, and travels with wife, Sara, on "Volunteers in Mission" trips around the world

Anderson Daniel is in the 6th grade at Central Elementary. He appeared in the TCP production of Alice in Wonderland and the NSU production of South Pacific. Anderson, who also sang in the OMEA Children's All-State Choir, loves basketball, video games & trombone.

Jon DiCandeloro is in the 4th grade at Greenwood Elementary. Jon has previously appeared in the TCP productions of *The Wind in the Willows* and *Alice in Wonderland*, and notes that he played a "rodent" in both productions. Jon is also involved in the Greenwood TLC Children's Theatre, Cub Scouts, TLC, Chess Club (currently a 4th grade champion at Greenwood), and Martial Arts.

Chris DuVall is an 8th grade student at Tahlequah Junior High, where he has a 4.0 grade point average, while taking honors classes. He plays the Alto-Saxophone for the Honor Band and placed in the All District Band for 2003. He is also a member of the National Junior Honor Society, Oklahoma Honor Society, R.I.S.E. program, Star program and 4-H. Chris attends Cornerstone Fellowship. He studies art, and piano, in which he has won 5 trophies with the Oklahoma Music Teachers Association. For hobbies, Chris enjoys playing golf with friends and traveling. Chris has performed in three other TCP plays, The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, Alice in Wonderland and The Wind in the Willows, in which he was named Best Supporting Actor 16 Years or Younger.

Becky Falling, who is in the 10th grade at Tahlequah High School, is appearing in her first TCP production. She has appeared in *The Puppy Who Wanted a Boy for Christmas*, and the 1st Annual Drama Valentine Dessert Theatre at Tahlequah High School.

Chloe Fennell is a 4th grade student at Shiloh Christian School. This is Chloe's first production with TCP, but she has previously participated in school plays.

He has appeared in the TCP productions of *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*, *Alice in Wonderland* (Best Supporting Actor 16 Years or Younger), and *The Wind in the Willows*. He has appeared in *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, Alice in Wonderland, Charolette's Web*, and *The Wind In the Willows* with TCP. Jonathan is a Boy Scout, takes piano lessons, enjoys soccer, learning how to pilot airplanes, robotics, and Asheron's Call. He has lived in Welling 9½ years.

Simon Manning, a 7th grade Student at Briggs School in their Gifted & Talented program, is also very active with the Student Council as Class Historian and Captain of the Academic. Simon also is a very active Boy Scout in Tahlequah's Troop 743, camping, doing community services, and learning many things, while working towards his Eagle Scout rank one day! Simon's first TCP performance was in *Charlotte's Web* as the Gander; then as a shepherd in the *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* and as Chief Weasel in *The Wind in the Willows*. Simon enjoys drawing, playing the piano, building his own creations & anything with LEGOS. He was the 2002 State SU BAHK DO Karate Champion (which he hopes to continue as soon as the play is complete!)

Cody McDowell, who is appearing in his first TCP production, is a student at Grandview School. He has appeared in a commercial for Oklahoma Tourism, was born in Tahlequah, and likes basketball, baseball, pool, bowling, hockey, golf, reading, and hamming for the camera.

T.J. Osburn is a sophomore at Tahlequah High School and works at TLC (after school program.)
This is T.J.'s first play with TCP, but he has appeared in *The Puppy Who Wanted a Boy for Christmas* and the 1st Annual Drama Dessert Theatre, both at THS. T.J. has lived in Tahlequah all his life and enjoys working with computers and playing video games.

Isaac Owen is homeschooled in the 1st grade. He appeared as Head King in a pre-school play and is involved in Tiger Cubs and soccer.

Austin Poulter attends Central Elementary where he is in the 5th grade. Austin began his short life on the stage with his first theatre class at NSU in River City Kids in 1997. With TCP, he has appeared as a Field Mouse in *The Wind in the Willows* and a Heart in *Alice in Wonderland*. Austin is also involved in TLC Children's Theatre, soccer and Boy Scouts.
